## Rates, Activities and Classes at MCYC

### Camp Use Fees

Use of camp for single activity - add \$2 per person to the cost of the activity.

Use of camp for partial day or no overnight stay - \$6 per person Use of camp is \$18 for one night and \$16 for 2 or more per person/per night.

Overnight Rates are as follows:

September - May - \$18 for one night and \$16 for two or more nights. Check weekend packages below as well.

June - August - \$18.25 per night. Weekend package rates still apply below!

## MCYC Program Descriptions

**Beginning Canoeing (\$3.50)** - This canoe instruction is for participants with no previous, formal canoe experience. The session is divided into two segments, which include dry land safety instruction and time in the water. **Available May 15 - September weather permitting.**

**Intermediate Canoe (\$4.50)** - This session is the follow-up to Beginning Canoe and includes dry land safety instruction and more time in the water working on parts of the Junior badge for boating. Campers must have had done beginning canoeing before signing up for this program. **Available May 15 - September weather permitting.**

**Low Ropes (\$4.00)** - A low initiative course designed to challenge the individual and build self-confidence and communication in a group supportive setting. **Available year round weather permitting.**

**High Ropes (\$25.00)** - Course consists of elements that are 20 - 35 feet off the ground. The course is made up of five obstacles to arrive at the grand finale, the Zip Line, which will take them back to the ground. Participants will be challenged to improve trust, communication, and overcome self-doubt. **Must be 13 to participate.** **Available mid-April through October. Weather permitting.**

**Orienteering (\$6.25)** - Campers are given a topographical map of the camp with the layout of the course. They have three hours to collect cards from each point in numerical order. *Compass skills is a pre-requisite for this activity.* **Available year round weather permitting.**

**Compass Skills (\$2.00)**- Campers are taught the skills that are required for traveling through a wilderness area by reading a topographical map and using a compass. **Available year round weather permitting.**

**Adventure Challenge (\$5.75)**- Campers go through a series of initiative games/activities and outdoor elements designed to work on teamwork, trust, cooperation, communication, and problem solving. **Available year round weather permitting.**

**Archery (\$3.00)**- Learn the basics of this sport, including proper stance, holding the bow, nocking an arrow, drawing the bow, aiming, releasing and follow-through. **Available April 17 - October. Weather permitting.**

**Hayride (\$2.75)**- A 20 - 30 minute ride in a tractor drawn hay wagon through the camp. **Available year round weather permitting.**

**Swimming** - Our lakefront swimming area is available from May 15 - Labor Day Weekend. We provide lifeguards for all groups. Groups provide aquatic supervisors (adults) to help. **Canoeing and swimming is not done at the same time. \$65 up to 25 people, \$150 for 26 - 50 people. More than 50 please call for pricing.**

**Wild Birds (\$2.50)**- Campers learn the thrill of attracting dozens of different types of wild birds to their own backyard. **Available year round.**

**Insects (\$2.50)**- Creepy crawly six-legged critters! Why did God put them here? Are they helpful or destructive? Find out lots of fascinating facts about the insect world. **Available year round.**

**Michigan Mammals (\$2.50)**- Mammals all share the characteristics of being warm blooded, having body hair, and suckling their young. You will be fascinated by what you will learn and surprised by the misconceptions you may have about these amazing mammals. **Available year round.**

**Trees (\$2.50)**- Trees are all around us, but do we really know what makes a tree different from other plants? Life as we know it could not exist without trees. **Available year round.**

**Edible Plants (\$2.50)**- Campers are taught about plants you can eat out in the fields, woods, or waters. The world is full of things for us to use and wild plants are just one of them. **Available year round.**

**Owls/Hawks (\$2.50)**- Some of these birds are near extinction. You will be surprised as you explore the myths and stranger than fiction truths about these exciting creatures of the air. **Available year round.**

**Reptiles & Amphibians (\$2.50)**- Many do not know the difference between these two classes of vertebrate. Frogs, toads, snakes, lizards, turtles...which are reptiles and which are amphibians? Learn the different habitats, functions, and characteristics of these animals. **Available year round.**

**Wetland Wonders (\$3.50)**- Explore the natural habitats many wetland creatures like frogs, snakes, and reptiles live in. Visit our wetlands and see how the plants and animals are adapted for life in the open and live in our wetland community. **Boots highly suggested.** **Available mid-April through mid-November. Weather permitting.**

## MCYC Program Descriptions - Continued

**Candle Making (\$2.75)**- Campers are instructed in the history of candle making and given the opportunity to make a dipped candle of their own to take home! Available year round.

**Leather Craft (\$3.50)**- Campers are instructed in the history of leather crafting and will complete a souvenir to take home. Available year round.

**Rope Making (\$2.50)**- Campers are instructed in the history of rope making and each group will make a rope to enjoy as a group at the end of the class. Available year round.

**Dairy Farm (\$4.50)**- Campers are taken on a tour of a local working dairy farm with an explanation of the milk production process from the cow to the truck. Campers will have the opportunity to pet calves and possibly even see a calf born!!

Note: This is an off-site event and transportation is provided for paying campers only. If there is space, adults are happy to come. Available year round.

**Petting Farm with Hayride (\$4.50)**- Opportunity for any group using the camp to have a hands-on learning experience with farm animals. Small groups are take to the farm where they can pet and interact with the animals. They are told about the animals and their characteristics. Campers are transported in our hay wagon to and from the petting farm. Weather permitting for the hay ride.

**Petting Farm (\$3.00)**- Same as above, but without the hay ride. Campers are driven in our camp vans.

**Horsemanship Class (\$3.50)**- Campers are instructed in what is involved in owning, caring for, and riding a horse. Three main areas are covered:

**Care** - Food, shelter, and medical needs of the horse.

**The relationship between man and horse** - Understanding how a horse thinks and acts so we know how to react around them.

**Riding a horse** - Grooming, saddling, bridling, and basic riding skills.

**Trail Rides (\$10)**- Campers will be led on a 30-minute trail ride through the camp by our trained wranglers. Campers MUST be at least 8 years old to ride. **Available year round weather permitting.**

**Horse Walks (\$5.50)**- Campers who are not yet old enough to go on a trail ride may be lead on a walk by one of our wranglers. **Campers MUST be at least 5 years old. Available year round weather permitting.**

**Scout Badges** - Jr. Horse Fan Badge (\$25), Jr. Horse Rider Badge (\$30), and Brownie Try-It Badges (\$15) are available. Call for details. Minimum charges apply for all three classes of 5 campers.

**One campfire is available to groups at no charge during your stay.  
Please make arrangements through Guest Services for your time and day.  
Space is limited, so it is on a first come, first serve basis.**

## Lodging

Each cabin is split into dorm style lodging and has their own bathroom and shower facilities. Each lodging area is bunk bed-style sleeping for 13 - 30 people and requires guests to bring their own bedding and toiletries.

- Available from late July - early June.
- A deposit of \$10 per person with a minimum of \$250 is necessary for each group.
- A Cleaning/Damage refundable deposit of \$100 per day is due upon application for use for groups using the camp for three or more nights.  
     This should be attached separately and will be held until the end of your visit. It will be returned based on satisfactory condition at checkout.
- MCYC is a non-smoking and non-alcohol facility. Failure to adhere to policy may result in dismissal from camp without refund of stay.
- **Pets of any kind are not permitted at camp.**
- Capacity of 300 campers from Mid-April through Labor Day weekend. From Labor Day to Mid-April capacity is 210.

## RV and Campers

Spend a night in nature and enjoy the blessings of what God has given us around a campfire. Bring your RV or camper and use our hook-ups. Electric and water hookups are available, but are limited.

- Available from late April - October.
- MCYC is a non-smoking and non-alcohol facility. Failure to adhere to policy may result in dismissal from camp without refund of stay.
- Pets of any kind are not permitted at camp.
- Maximum of 8 people per site.

## Policies

### PLEASE REVIEW ALL INFORMATION CAREFULLY

#### Guidelines

- A tentative number in your group is required at time of application. A final count for meals is required 7 days prior to retreat date. If final count for meals drops below indicated number at time of retreat, a 5% variance will be allowed.
- An agenda or schedule that has been established by a group will need to be given to Guest Services no later than 30 days prior to retreat date. This will help us schedule requested events from MCYC as well as meals.
- The group will be responsible for registration of guests at their designated meeting site.
- Additional rooms beyond what is needed for your group could incur a charge of \$200 per room per visit.
- Groups will be invoiced upon arrival to camp. Final payment is required at that time.
- MCYC is a totally smoke free facility and has a no-alcohol policy.
- **All campers and adults that participate in an activity or class that is given by MCYC will need to have an activity release form.**
- Copy Services are available through Guest Services during meal times at a cost of \$.10 for B & W and \$.25 for color.
- Lost and Found will be kept for 7 days. Any lost articles will be returned via USPS at the cost of the guest. Any items left more than 7 days will be discarded or donated.
- Wireless service is provided at Hawley Lodge. Please ask for network password and network ID should you need it.
- All rates are subject to change, though advance notice will be given.

#### Application and Deposit

- Requested dates are not secured until both a signed application and deposit are received.
- Deposits received to secure your overnight retreat dates will be applied to your final invoice.
- A \$25 fee will be applied to applications received less than 30 days from retreat.
- Any changes to schedule less than 14 days to event could be charged a \$25 administrative fee. This will be discussed by Guest Services prior to changes being made.
- A deposit of \$10 per person with a minimum of \$250 is necessary for each group.
- A Cleaning/Damage refundable deposit of \$100 per day is due upon application for use for groups using the camp for three or more nights. This should be attached separately and will be held until the end of your visit. It will be returned based on satisfactory condition at checkout.

#### Cancellation Policy

- When it is necessary that a group cancel a retreat, deposits are refundable up to 30 days prior to retreat less a \$25 administrative fee.
- With cancellations, deposits may be transferred to a future date only when notice of cancellation has been given on or before specified date on preliminary invoice.
- If it is necessary for MCYC to cancel a retreat, a full refund will be given.

#### Check-In

- Is at Hawley Lodge upon arrival. Check in is at pre-arranged time as per your application for camp use. Payment is expected at this time. Please allow 10 - 15 minutes for check-in.
- Have activity release forms ready for review. Discuss any concerns at this time that you may have with allergies or activity levels of campers with Guest Services.
- Receive final schedule for your visit if necessary.
- This is a good time to get any sports equipment that you may need or reserve it for the following day.

#### Check out

- Check out is at 11 a.m. on last day of stay or three hours past last meal. Late checkout please arrange with Guest Services. Additional charges may apply.

#### What is expected at check-out?

- Wipe down sinks, take out trash to outside trash cans, sweep floors, turn off all lights.
- Mop floors only if there is standing water in room or bathroom. Mops are located outside of rooms.
- Bring room keys to Guest Service office and leave in tray or drop off with Guest Services. Lost keys cost \$25 to replace.
- If you used a conference or meeting room it is expected that all chairs and tables are put away as they were when you came. Refrigerator, sink, coffee maker, microwave and stove should be cleaned. Cleaning supplies are below sink. It is not necessary to vacuum, however please sweep up as best as possible.

We hope that your stay with us is safe and enjoyable. If an injury should occur at MCYC during your stay you must report the injury immediately to Guest Services. An injury report may need to be filled out. Please contact us if you have any questions.
